

Tamil Nadu Police announces Internal vigilance cells all over state

CHENNAI: Tamil Nadu Police on Wednesday announced the constitution of internal vigilance cells in all districts to strengthen integrity, transparency, and public confidence on the Police Department.

According to an official communication from the office of the Director General of Police (DGP)/ Head of Police Force, Mahesh Kumar Aggarwal, these cells have been established to prevent, monitor, and enquire into allegations of corruption, misconduct, abuse of position by police personnel/officers and other unethical practices.

Miscellaneous police bikes on station premises in Pudukkottai "To facilitate easy reporting of such complaints, district/city-wise Internal Vigilance Cell Phone/WhatsApp numbers have been provided for public com-



plaints. Citizens may report instances of corruption, misconduct, abuse of authority, or other unethical practices by police personnel through the designated numbers of their respective district or city Internal Vigilance

Cell," an official release noted.

The Police Department encourages all citizens to make use of this facility and actively support the promotion of transparency, accountability, and corruption-free policing in Tamil Nadu.

"The Internal Vigilance Cell assures all complainants and members of the public that the identity of complainants and witnesses will be kept strictly confidential. No complainant shall be subjected to any form of harassment, intimidation, or retaliation for filing a complaint," the release stated. The DGP encourages all citizens to come forward and report complaints fearlessly, with the assurance that their complaints will be received and dealt with in a fair and impartial and timely manner.

The Internal Vigilance Cell will be monitored by senior police officers on a regular basis. Greater Chennai Police (GCP) had already created a vigilance cell and public were encouraged to whatsapp complaints to 78717 23906.

Family dispute turns deadly for two in Krishnagiri, Coimbatore

COIMBATORE: Family disputes turned deadly for two as a young woman was stabbed to death by her husband in Krishnagiri and a document writer was beaten to death by his brother in Coimbatore on Tuesday night. In Krishnagiri, near Hosur, VM Ellappa (52), a farmer from Chinnabekundapalli village, killed his wife Prema (38) following an altercation while returning in a car on the Kalamangalam-Koolichandram four-lane road. The couple was returning after meeting their sons staying in the private school hostel, when an argument escalated into violence. Police said Prema picked up a knife kept in

while the woman's body was recovered and sent to Krishnagiri GH for post-mortem. The estranged couple reunited only recently following intervention by police. In another incident, the Coimbatore police arrested Sivakumar (60) for brutally assaulting his brother Velusamy (56), a document writer from Devendra Vellarai Street near Singanailur with a wooden log over a longstanding property dispute. The deceased was residing alone, as his wife had separated from him over some family issues.

TN govt affirms precedence for Tamizh Thaa Vaazhthu, Madras HC close plea

CHENNAI: The Madras High Court has closed a plea challenging the placement of Tamizh Thaa Vaazhthu in the third position during official functions, after noting that the Tamil Nadu government has reaffirmed that the State Song will be sung at the beginning of programmes.

A division bench comprising Chief Justice SA Dharmadhikari and Justice G Arul Murugan



closed the plea after taking note of the revised circular allowing States to decide when to render their State songs, and the Tamil Nadu

Government Order reaffirming that Tamizh Thaa Vaazhthu shall be sung at the beginning of programmes across educational institutions,

government offices and other establishments.

Miscellaneous torches police bikes on station premises in Pudukkottai. The Bench held that the petitioner's grievance had been addressed by the circular and the Government Order, leaving no further issue for judicial determination.

The petition, filed by Ananya Radhakrishnan, contended that placing Tamizh Thaa Vaazhthu in the third position during the ceremony caused deep anguish among the people and amounted to an unwarranted dilution

of the ceremonial dignity traditionally accorded to the State Song.

According to the petitioner, the Ministry of Home Affairs' January 28 circular, titled 'Orders Relating to the National Song of India', does not impose any constitutional or statutory or executive prohibition against commencing official State functions with an officially recognised State Song. The plea stated that the circular merely regulates the order between the National Song and the National Anthem when both are

The Human Immune Project's Strategic Blueprint To Harness AI and Immunology

The Human Immune Project has released a Scientific Plan to create the world's largest immunological dataset and develop AI models to better understand and leverage the immune system for improved health outcomes globally. The plan involves establishing global study sites and developing advanced AI tools to analyze immune system variations and responses.

The Human Immune Project (HIP), a global nonprofit initiative, released its Scientific Plan today, April 29, on World Immunology Day, the organization announced. The plan provides a detailed roadmap of how the Human Immune Project and its network of global study sites will generate the world's largest and most diverse immunological dataset and use these data to power publicly available AI models of the immune system. Importance of the Immune System

"The immune system is the epicenter of human health, and our newly released Scientific Plan outlines an actionable, global strategy for how we can unlock the secrets of the immune system and harness its power to improve health for all," said Dr. Hans Keirstead, CEO of the Human Immune Project.

The human immune system is one of the most complex systems in the world—and one of its most important. It determines whether we survive infancy, which diseases we get, how we age, and how long we'll live. Understanding our immune system is the key to fighting disease and improving health for all. Yet its complexity has limited our ability to tap into this potential—until now. Despite these tremendous advances, our understanding of the immune system remains limited: less than one percent of the immunological data necessary to understand immune function and diversity on a global scale are available. As such, HIP's first mission is generating diverse immunological datasets at scale.

Global Data Collection Efforts To generate these data, HIP is establishing a network of global study sites that reflect the diversity of humanity (across age, ethnicity, geography, sex, and socioeconomic status) and immune responses. Data will be generated through a phased approach and enabled by HIP-engineered Immune Monitoring Kits—a collection of assays and operating procedures that facilitate

rapid, robust, and standardized data collection worldwide. An initial draft of HIP's Scientific Plan was shared with a group of global experts at the "Human Immune Project into Action" Conference, hosted at CosmoCaixa Museum of Science by the CaixaResearch Institute and HIP in November 2023. The conference provided participants an opportunity to input into the Scientific Plan and concluded with an endorsement of the mission and vision of the Human Immune Project. Since November, HIP's science team, led by Dr. John Tsang, Dr. Shai Shen-Orr, and Dr. Orit Lavi, has refined the plan using feedback gathered at the conference. The result is a detailed strategy to decode and model the immune system with the ultimate goal of improving health for all. "The Human Immune Project is at the cutting edge of scientific discovery and is uniquely positioned to provide the scientific and medical communities with the knowledge and tools to innovate new diagnostics, drugs, vaccines, and immunotherapies that can address disease, elongate healthspans, and enable more personalized and effective health care for all. I could not be prouder to lead this global effort," said Dr. Keirstead. This collaborative, global effort will produce local, national, and global datasets that enable scientists to assess developmental and age-dependent changes and computationally stitch together the health trajectory of different population groups worldwide. Pilot Sites and AI Development With the Scientific Plan now fully articulated, the Human Immune Project is working to establish its initial Pilot Sites in 10 to 15 states-of-the-art sites that will collect data, help refine the site model, and prepare HIP for scale. These sites will be spread globally with a focus on the Global South and sub-Saharan Africa, specifically.

As data collection progresses, HIP will begin to develop AI models—first predictive, then mechanistic—that will deepen our understanding of immune responses and individual and population-based health trajectories. These models will provide a holistic view of the immune system and empower scientists with a new, transformative tool to advance drug development, strengthen personalized medicine, and increase healthspans. These

data and models will additionally produce new insights relevant to nearly all health conditions, including key global health challenges related to maternal health, aging and cognitive decline, and disease evolution. Collaboration with the Refinement of the Scientific Plan
